Happy Birthday St Bert's On 9th September we will be celebrating 41 years since the creation of St Bert's school. Have you ever wondered who St Berteline was?

St Berteline was an English prince and was not behaving himself. As a result, he was sent over to the King in Ireland to learn how to behave like a prince. Whilst there he fell in love with the King's daughter and married her. He brought his wife, who was pregnant, back to England to meet his family. On the way back the baby started to arrive so Berteline went for help and while he was away his wife was attacked by wolves and he returned to find her dead. He was heartbroken and he decided to return to England permanently and lived as a recluse dedicating his life to serving God.

We now have a Church and a school named after him, where others are encouraged to follow in his footsteps.

Ear Piercing


