



We have received numerous complaints in relation to parking around the area which is causing a danger to other road users and pedestrians.

Double yellow lines are placed on roads where parking would be hazardous or inconvenient to others, as stated in the highway code. Causing vehicles to move to the wrong side of the road to pass a line of parked vehicles is especially dangerous outside a primary school.

As Spring/Summer approaches and visibility is affected by the weather parking in such a dangerous manner could lead to an injury or worse to your child or someone else's.

Please think about the consequences of your parking in this area. Parking is at a premium around all areas due to the number of vehicles on the road and there is not a great deal that can be done to help with this. It is up to you as responsible road users to park in a safe way without obstructing the highway.

Please take this letter as a warning that if we continue to receive complaints, we will issue parking tickets. There are NO excuses for parking in this way - I will only be a minute, where else am I supposed to park will not stop you from getting a ticket.

Blue badge holders although you are allowed to park on double yellow lines you are **not** allowed to cause an obstruction.
